

Fraser (1), where the circumstances were similar, (the will being above thirty years old, and the testator having died within thirty years,) the parties who sought to establish the will proved the handwriting of two of the witnesses who were dead, and after due inquiry, the other witness could not be found: no account of him could be obtained. For this reason, and on theauthority of the case of Cunliffe v. Sefton(2), the Master of the Rolls admitted the will to be read. This case is therefore the strongest authority for the present objection; it is clear, that had the witness been proved to be alive, he must have been produced. There is good reason for drawing a distinction in this respect between a deed, and a will of real property. A deed requires no witness; but such a will requires witnesses pursuant to the Statute of Frauds. No case whatever has decided that, where the testator has died within thirty years, and a witness to the will is proved to be living, it is not necessary to call the witness; and in the case of Lord Rancliffe. Parkms(3), Lord Eldon observed, that the age of a will did not, of necessity, prove its validity, unless possession has gone along with it; and from what is said by that noble and learned Judge, it may be collected that his opinion was unfavourable to a dispensing with the proof of the execution of the will, where that proof is within the reach of them who have put the will forward. To the second point: The learned Judge carried the doctrine of presumption much further than it had ever been carried before; the cases of Doe d. George v. Jesson (.!), and Doe d. Banning v. Griffin (5), have gone the farthest. In the former, it was proved that the person had gone to sea, and had never aft...
